January 19 Demonstrator JACK KING

Jack King, a native of Pratt, Kansas, is a renowned artist, lecturer and art instructor. He began his studies as a young man in East Moline, Illinois, under the tutelage of Leo Eugene Wright, noted landscape artist and art educator.

After high school, Mr. King continued to pursue his artistic endeavors while serving in the U.S. Navy. This culminated in a one-man exhibition in Key West, Florida, in 1957. Upon his honorable discharge, Mr. King began his formal art education at El Camino College in Torrance, California. He then completed a Bachelor's Degree in art with honors, at Cal State, Long Beach. In 1974, Mr. King received his Master's Degree in Art, with specialization in lithographic printmaking from Cal State, Fullerton. His Masters show was the most highly attended student exhibition in the history of the university.

In addition to a distinguished career as an adjunct professor in the Fine Arts Department of El Camino College, Mr. King has exhibited his work professionally for over twenty-five years, participating in both one-man and group exhibitions. Mr. King is also a highly-sought-after and popular lecturer in art and design at educational institutions, as well as private art and cultural organizations throughout Southern California. He will be lecturing to us on the artist Pierre Auguste Renoir.

When he is not occupied by teaching or lecturing, Mr. King devotes the majority of his time to working in his studio.

TONY PODUE WINS HIGH PRAISE

Tony Podue won the Award of Excellence and two Special Recognition Awards in the 13th Annual All Media Juried Online International Art Exhibition. Judge Laurence Bradshaw, Professor of Art, wrote the following about Tony: "Tony Podue of Anaheim Hills, California, is a master painter deserving of high praise. All of his works in this exhibition are masterpieces. 'Boats at the Old Cannery' is outstanding in technique and composition. The warm and cool coloration adds impact as well as the attention to perfect detail. 'L.A. Fire Boats' is similar in quality in all aspects, with the addition of the effective tonal contrast seen in the reflections in the water. And 'Point Fermin Lighthouse' gives a strong sense of space in a somewhat diamond compositional formation.
