## President's Message March 2010

Our last meeting month of this year is May, which is just around the corner. I just wanted to kick back and coast for the last few months of my presidency but that's not going to happen. This month's meeting is the Marguerite E. Lee competition, which is covered in its own article of this newsletter, please check it out.

Our elections of A.A.A. new officers for next year will be held in May. I have picked-up sections of our By-Laws to help explain what will take place.

### ARTICLE IV – BOARD OF DIRECTORS & THEIR ELECTION

*Section 1. The Business of the Association shall be governed by a Board of Directors of nine (9) members, who shall be nominated and elected each year. Section 2. Nominations for directors shall be made by a nominating committee of five (5) members elected at the regular Association meeting in February. Three (3) shall be from the general membership and two (2) from the Board of Directors. a. The committee shall elect its own chairman. b. The report of the nominating committee shall be presented at the March membership meeting at which time nominations may be made from the floor. c. Only those individuals eligible and who have given their consent to serve if elected shall be nominated and/or be elected as a Director. d. The election shall be at the April Association meeting and the Directors meeting. e. Elections shall be by ballot. If there is only one candidate for each office, the ballot may be dispensed with and the vote shall be by voice.*

### ARTICLE V – OFFICERS

*Section 1. The officers of the Association shall be a president, four (4) vice presidents, secretary and treasurer. Section 2. Officers shall serve for a one (1) year term and no more than two (2) consecutive terms in the same office. Section 3. Nominees for the office must have served as voting members for a period of one (1) year prior to the May meeting at which time they may assume the duties of office.*

*Section 4. Officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors from among its members at the April meeting. Officers elect shall assume their duties at the close of the Annual Meeting in May. Section 5. Each office upon expiration of the term or in case of resignation shall turn over to his or her successor or Presidency, without delay, all records and information pertinent to the respective office.*

At the March meeting night we will read the list of the nominating committee and will ask for nominations from the floor. At next month's meeting in April we will vote for officers. I would encourage any of you to search your soul and run for an office on A.A.A. board. Our Bi-Laws state that we should have a nine-member board of directors. Unfortunately we have not had the commitment from our members to fill that number. We have had to look the other way when keeping people in

the same position for more than the two terms, simply because no one else was willing to take the office. So we need you! You're never too young or too old to help your art association. The A.A.A. board meets on the fourth Tuesday of the month at the downtown community center at 6:30 pm. for about two hours. Most board positions will not require a lot of your personal time. If you can run for an office, we will give you all the help and tools you need to do the job.
