



DECEMBER 15 DEMONSTRATOR WILLELLYN McFARLAND

Renowned watercolorist Willellyn McFarland has been interested in art for as long as she can remember.

While attending USC she earned a BFA in painting. She became an art teacher and while raising her family she taught in elementary school and in Adult Education classes. During that period, she became interested in watercolor and was accepted as a signature member into the National Watercolor Society (then called the California Watercolor Society). She has held many offices in that society, including being President twice, and helped jury one of their annual exhibitions.

Other groups in which she has been member include Women Painters West and Watercolor West, where she is past President and currently Catalog Director. She is a signature member of that group as well.

Among her many awards include those from the Watercolor West Annual Juried Exhibition, the San Diego International Exhibition, and most recently, selected as featured artist in the Andre Agassi Foundation's annual art auction and fund raiser in Las Vegas, Nevada. She has been published in The Artist's Magazine, The Artistic Touch 3 and 4, and Artists of California. Willellyn is included in Who's Who in the World 2000 and Who's Who in the West, 2000, and 2001. Slides of her paintings are included in the collection of the Smithsonian Institution in Washington D.C. Her work was also included in the International Invitational Watercolor Exhibition in Taiwan in 2008. The US Forest Service has also commissioned her to do several paintings for Interpretative Signs along the trails of the San Gabriel Mountains.

"Color is the dominant theme in most of my paintings," says Willellyn. "I enjoy experimenting with a variety of techniques, always seeking beauty in the subject and hoping that the viewer will react in a positive way to my work."
